It's December, it's Scotland – we expect it to be cold, and we are ready to deal with that. We recommend that people come prepared for a good Scottish winter, and a great outdoor Scottish party, and dress accordingly."

Ms Hyslop, said:-"Scotland is the best place in the world to see in the bells with preparations well underway for our Hogmanay celebrations. We Scots are known for our warm welcome - even in freezing temperatures - which is what makes Scotland such a great country to visit, all year round. We know how to throw a great party, especially at Hogmanay.

Edinburgh's Hogmanay launches with a brand new Opening Event in Resolution Square (the newly named event space on Mound Precinct) alongside the popular Torchlight Procession and Son et Lumière on Thursday December 30 with the Street Party, Keilidh and Concert in the Gardens leading to the spectacular Midnight Fireworks from Edinburgh Castle on Friday December 31.
