Over the last five years we've run lots of projects in all sorts of areas but we'd always secretly wanted to do something on song lyrics because they have huge power, and in our City of Literature we're passionate about the power of words. When Glasgow was designated a UNESCO City of Music, then we knew we had our excuse and our chance to get lyrical!"
