Guest speakers will be David Baird, Vice-president of the World Burns Federation, who will read the 'immortal memory, Jim Haining, former President of the Burns Howf Club in Dumfries, will give his usual entertaining 'Toast to the Lassies' and Petro Kormylo (co-author of worlds first and recently published Burns book in Ukrainian) will be reciting some Burns and Shevchenko in Ukrainian.

A combination of Ukrainian and Scottish National dress will be the order of the evening

This year's celebration is the fourth year of the annual Burns/Shevchenko dinner.

The evening will end with the singing of Scots Wha Hae and the Ukrainian National Anthem, Shche Ne Vmerla.
