Women's Rugby — Scotland v Wales

Scotland's Women's team were the last chance to save an RBS 6-Nations clean sweep for Wales over the weekend, but came up short to the tune of a 41 points to 12 defeat.

Now Scotland seemed to lift their game and following a Welsh yellow, Tracy Balmer was forced over the line by the pack for Scotland's first score and her maiden try for the National team.

Another yellow for Wales near full time lead to a scrum a few yards out, which the forwards managed to convert into points, with Lindsey Wheeler grounding the ball for the second try.

Wales weren't completely finished, however, and scored their

final try deep (very deep, it seemed) into injury time, to bring the final score to Scotland 12, Wales 41.
