EIFF - Ewan McGregor to attend Edinburgh premiere

The Edinburgh International Film Festival has announced that the European Premiere of David Mackenzie's 'Perfect Sense' will move from The Cameo to the larger, 1500 seater Edinburgh Festival Theatre venue due to a sell out of advance tickets. The screening, which will take place on Saturday 18th June, will also have cast Ewan McGregor in attendance.
