## Pensioners' art on display in Edinburgh

Older people from a City of Edinburgh Council day centre will be showing off their artistic talents at a special exhibition.



Service users at the Portlee Resource Centre in North Edinburgh have put together an exhibition which includes paintings, tapestries, knitting, shell craft and papier mâché.
