

# Royal Engagement at Dundas Castle

✖ Top Scottish singer-songwriter Charlotte Gordon Cumming has announced that she will perform at a black tie event to mark the 21st anniversary of conservation charity Tusk Trust.

Charlotte and her band will share the spotlight at Dundas Castle on May 19 with comedy legend Rory Bremner, who will perform a cabaret on the night.

She will perform songs from her recently released album 'The Brave Songs', a collection of music inspired by best selling novel 'The Brave', penned by Charlotte's husband Nicholas Evans.
