

STV election poll announced

The latest TNS-BMRB poll for STV shows that the Scottish Conservatives have increased their share of the vote from the previous poll at the end of March.

David McLetchie, Scottish Conservative Campaign Manager for the Scottish Parliament election, said:

“This is further proof that Annabel’s common sense approach and telling it like it is has been going down well on doorsteps across Scotland. Voters appreciate honesty, acknowledging we have been realistic about the challenges of today whilst being optimistic about tomorrow.

“They also know we have delivered for Scotland over the past four years and will deliver again over the next five years. Scotland needs someone to stand up to the excesses of nationalism and socialism and that someone is Annabel.

Welcoming the TNS-BMRB opinion poll conducted for stv to coincide with tonight’s Scottish Parliament election leaders’ debate, Scottish National Party Depute Leader and Deputy First Minister Nicola Sturgeon said:

“This is an excellent poll – it indicates that people want to re-elect the SNP Government and Alex Salmond for First Minister because they want to achieve the five-year Council Tax freeze, protection for Scotland’s health budget, and retention of the
