Edinburgh Festival Fringe Review: Improvised the Musical (***)

Improvised musicals are a very difficult genre of theatre especially when the audience give them difficult subjects and titles, however the 'No Shoes Theatre Group' carry it off very well. The quality of the acting and the use of props originating in the audience was of a high standard. Six actors and a live band (percussion, keyboard and double bass) are very much in tune with each other and appear to be doing what they really enjoy.
