The stagnant property market means that fewer people are putting their homes up for sale and fewer buyers can get mortgage funding for a purchase, so many solicitors are feeling the pinch. Thankfully our matrimonial side of the business is proving more popular than ever, and is allowing us to maintain the same overall company performance we achieved in 2010."
