The City of Edinburgh Council have yet again postponed a difficult decision to the next council meeting at the end of November. Trying to approve the <u>Alternative Business Model</u> proved an impossible task yesterday.

Police are seeking witnesses to a potentially dangerous incident in the city centre in the early hours of Thursday morning, after a sandbag was thrown from George IV Bridge into the Cowgate .

The sandbag narrowly missed pedestrians when it was thrown from the bridge into the roadway around 00:30am.

The item, which weighed approximately 10kg, had the potential to cause serious injury, and police are appealing for any information that can assist their inquiries.

A police spokesman said: "This was a mindless act of criminal recklessness, the consequences of which could have been very severe, and it is only by good fortune that no-one was seriously injured.

"We want anyone who witnessed the sandbag being thrown from George IV Bridge around half past midnight to contact police immediately. Similarly, anyone else who has any information that can assist our inquiries should also get in touch."
