Police urge thinking ahead to winter

■ Lothian and Borders Police are participating in a national campaign urging motorists and other road users to make sure that they are fully prepared for winter.

The "Get Ready for Winter Weekend", which is being led by the <u>Association of Chief Police Officers Scotland (ACPOS)</u> will aim to educate motorists on what they should do to make sure their vehicles are roadworthy this winter. "Whether it be ensuring that your tyres, lights and brakes are in good condition, or that you wear high-visibility clothing, all road users have a responsibility to make sure they are prepared for the months ahead.
