We believe the benefits of the Award will be felt across the region long after its 12 month timescale. The programme has been enabled by the generosity of private individuals and organisations including Nesta, RedLynx, MacRoberts LLP and YoungScot; and we invite others to contribute their donation to assist us in providing more places on the programme."

As part of the Incubation Award winners will be able to choose a location for a professional work base in Edinburgh, Midlothian or Fife.

Over the year there will be group and 1-2-1 learning and support sessions in a range of subjects covering legal, financial, IT, business planning and marketing. This will be complimented by leadership and governance support including working with volunteers.
