The charity offered priceless support and I wanted to help by giving something back. I didn't find the experience scary, I felt safe with the people around me and I was attached to someone so it wasn't a problem for me — I loved every second of it."

Funds raised will help the Sick Kids Friends Foundation go that extra mile to providing extra medical equipment, improving services and supporting the friends and family of sick children receiving treatment at Edinburgh's Royal Hospital for Sick Children.
