Police in Edinburgh are appealing for information to help trace relatives of a man who has died at his home in the Capital.

Francis David O'Neill, (59), was found dead at his home in Dumbryden Gardens on Tuesday afternoon. There are no

suspicious circumstances surrounding his death, and a report has been sent to the Procurator Fiscal.

There is little information available regarding any family or friends of Mr O'Neill, who was born in Dundee. It is believed that his mother now stays in Australia and that he may have an aunt called Heather Hutchison living in the Manchester area, however enquiries have so far been unsuccessful.

A Lothian and Borders Police spokesman said: - "We are appealing to anyone who knew Francis O'Neill, who has any information that can assist us in tracing any of his relatives, to contact police.

"Anyone else who has any other information that can assist our enquiries should also get in touch."
