Today in Holyrood Edinburgh City Centre MSP, Marco Biagi, has lodged a motion as follows:-

S4M-04364 Marco Biagi: Going the Extra Yard-That the Parliament welcomes the renovation of the playground of Edinburgh-based children's play charity, The Yard, as part of the BBC television programme, DIY SOS, for Children in Need week; notes the difficult financial circumstances that The Yard faced six years ago; understands that it is now in a much stronger position and hopes that the renovation will allow the service to continue to flourish; acknowledges what it considers the valuable work being undertaken by The Yard and the vital services that it has been providing to children and young people with additional support needs in 25 years of service; commends the opportunities for independence and personal growth that The Yard provides; considers The Yard as a fine example from which others can learn, and wishes it all the best for its 25th anniversary year and for many years to come.

Meanwhile at Parliamentary Questions at 11.40 questions have been lodged by Edinburgh and Lothians MSPs as follows:-

Jim Eadie: To ask the Scottish Government what progress is being made through the extended hours initiative to widen public access to out-of-hours GP services. (S40-01359)

Alison Johnstone: To ask the Scottish Government what action

it is taking to ensure that school outdoor environments promote physical activity and healthy lifestyles. (S40-01360)

This will then be followed by First Minister's Questions and a ministerial statement by Transport Minister Keith Brown on the West Coast mainline franchise. This was granted to First Group but that was cancelled yesterday by the UK government.

Does this affect us in Edinburgh? We think it does, if it impacts on all rail franchises. East Coast currently run the franchise from Edinburgh to London, and we feel that recent developments have to put the future of that line in some doubt. The franchise was returned to Government ownership when National Express East Coast handed it back.

It appears that <u>The Scotsman</u> agrees with our view that the railways are in disarray. But what do you think? Should there now be a major overhaul of the railways and the way they are run? Is it time to get Michael O'Leary from Ryanair to apply his magic to our railways?
