Council apology over rubbish – Planning – Rush Hour Concert – The Henry Girls – Irn Bru curry anyone?

<u>The BBC</u> report that the council has issued an apology to residents who are still encountering difficulties with their rubbish collections. Today on the council website the update reeports which areas are still behind in the new collection schedules:-

Wednesday 10 October

We are experiencing delays today with the following collection routes;

- Food waste collections in Barnton, Cammo, Craigleith, Ravelston, Boswall, Parkhead, Sighthill areas.
- Green wheelie bins in Dreghorn areas.
- Communal and Trade Waste bins in Holyrood, Viewcraig, Oxgangs, Morningside, and Craigour areas.
- Chute fed bins in Hollyrood, Viewcraig, Oxgangs, Morningside, and Craigour areas.
- Packaging banks in Leith, Morningside and Comely Bank areas.

The Development Management Sub Committee meets this morning and one of the agenda items deals with the flood defence work on the Water of Leith near Warriston Road. The papers say:-"The application is for: Construction of a reinforced concrete raised walkway and floodwall structure." The effect of some of this work has been contentious after the council felled a number of trees <u>despite local objections</u>. The Council report says it is minded to grant the planning application.
