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WHO ARE YOU AND WHERE DID YOU COME FROM

Now locally based, I am originally from Aberdeen, where I started working life as a nurse. I then moved into the commercial sector, with a role in pharmaceutical sales — this is where my interest in search and selection and the importance of effective recruitment began.
