There will be a flurry of red and white across Edinburgh this weekend, as not just Santa himself, but many hundreds of lookalikes, descend upon the city.

Santa weekend kicks off later today, as the man himself makes his grand arrival on a reindeer-drawn sleigh. Celebrations start at 5:00pm in St Andrew Square Garden, with special performances by gymnastic elves, sugar plum fairies and a Brazilian Samba Band, getting the crowd in the Christmas spirit, ready to welcome Santa. This will be followed by a festive sleigh parade along George Street, as Santa waves and

rings his bell, bringing more Christmas cheer to the capital.

After the spectacular parade, Santa will return to St Andrew Square Garden to tend to his reindeer and meet some of his young visitors. The reindeer are making a welcome return to the city this year, and will be available to visit in St Andrew Square Garden between 11:00am and 3:00pm every Friday, Saturday and Sunday leading up to Christmas.

More Santas will be coming to town tomorrow, as volunteer Santas head to West Princes Street Gardens for the tenth Great Edinburgh Santa Run. The run turns the city centre into a sea of red and white, as Santas of all ages run, jog or walk their way around the 1.5km circuit of West Princes Street Gardens, to raise money for the When You Wish Upon a Star foundation. The funds raised from this appeal will be used to send children with life-threatening illnesses to Lapland this festive period.

Registration opens at 9:00am in West Princes Street Gardens by the Ross Bandstand, followed by a fun, interactive warm-up session at 10.00am ready for the run to start at 11:00am.

Commenting on the weekend's festivities, Lord Provost, Rt Hon Donald Wilson said, "Once again, we have an action-packed weekend ahead of us, filled with festive fun for all the family. Our ongoing programme of fantastic, often quirky, Christmas events provides the perfect opportunity to enjoy Edinburgh at its most magical."

Nickie Gott, managing director of She's Gott It!, Edinburgh's Christmas producers, added: "Santa's arrival and the Great Edinburgh Santa Run are always incredible events, and are two of the most popular of the festive programme. Come and get in the Christmas spirit with Santa — or as Santa — this weekend!"

Santa will be returning to the city every day from 9 December through to Christmas Eve, as he collects his mail from the post-boxes at the Highland Market and the ice rink at 11:00am

and 4:00pm. After collecting his post, Santa will make his way to the entrance of the 3D cinema, to tell children some stories of Christmas past.
