

# Edinburgh Guarantee positions to be available online

## ONE-STOP ONLINE PORTAL FOR YOUNG PEOPLE'S VACANCIES

The City of Edinburgh Council is teaming up with online recruitment platform [Recruitwork](#) to offer a dedicated online portal for the city's school leavers.

From today, all vacancies and opportunities that become available through the [Edinburgh Guarantee](#) will be published online on the Recruitwork website, a service that matches young people to employers and their vacancies.

The Edinburgh Guarantee, led by the Council in partnership with public, private and voluntary sector partners, is working to ensure that every school leaver in the city has the choice of a job, training or further education. The Council aims to build on the success of the scheme, which has helped generate over 1000 additional opportunities for young people since it started in late 2011.

Young people will get access to the site while still at school, and be able to browse it for opportunities and upload their CVs.

The service is being launched with the advertisement of [12 internship positions](#) within NHS Lothian. These six month-long, paid roles are in a range of services, and offer a unique opportunity for a recent school leaver to get valuable experience in a real working environment.
