David is looking forward to his new exciting role; he is adding Lifeboat Operations Manager to his already demanding role as Station Mechanic, as well as holding down a full time job. His commitment to Queensferry Lifeboat is staggering. The other members of the RNLI lifeboat crew are looking forward to welcoming David's expertise, his sound judgement and his ability to make a sign for everything!

Tom will be sorely missed by all at the station, not that we think he will be keeping away for too long, as he will be keeping a watch on them as Chairman of the Lifeboat Management Group, offering his expertise as they move forward.
