Edinburgh hosts gathering of international lawyers

Lawyers from 26 countries are to meet in Edinburgh today when they will be addressed by Kenny MacAskill MSP, Cabinet Secretary for Justice. The occasion is a meeting of law firms that are members of Lexwork, the international network of independent law firms. The conference is being hosted by Lexwork's Scottish member firm, Gillespie Macandrew.

Derek McCulloch of Gillespie Macandrew, who will chair the conference, said:-"This is an excellent opportunity for these international commercial lawyers to learn about how the interrelationship might change between Scotland and the rest of the world should the 2014 referendum result in Scotland becoming independent.
