Five things you need to know today

A few years back it was the hole in the ground in Castle Terrace which caused people in the city to complain about lack of progress with a prominent city centre site, and now it is the area of land at Caltongate which has attracted the same kind of attention more recently.

This site is on the east side of the council's own building at Waverley Court right next to the main east coast railway line, and the new planning application by Artisan REI is for seven parallel applications for various permissions. The development encompasses hotels, commercial, community uses and leisure along with alterations to the public realm. This is expected to include a new square around which there will be 400 hotel rooms, 28 shops, and around 200 homes with some of these being affordable homes.

When the new developer took over the site from the failed Mountgrange which collapsed in 2009, the company announced that the 640,000 square feet site would now be developed by South African investors who hoped to "breathe new life into a project that has been dormant for more than a decade."
