## Another wonderful ceremony held at St Giles Cathedral

Leading figures from Edinburgh's business community have taken part in a traditional ceremony which dates back to Scotland's first Parliament.

Dressed in ceremonial gowns, members of The Edinburgh Merchant Company attended the Kirking of the Master service at another ancient symbol of Scotland's capital city — St. Giles' Cathedral.

The Merchant Company does a huge amount of good work within the city with both young people and the frail and elderly and I will do my best to live up to the high standards laid down by the 262 Old Masters that have gone before me."
