Government announces fund to help young entrepreneurs

Finance Secretary John Swinney today announced the creation of 'Young Scottish EDGE Fund' to help support the next generation of businessmen and women turn their ideas into successful businesses.

The new fund will be open to 18-25 year olds who can apply for funding and support from public, private and third sector partners. The applicants will be invited to pitch their ideas to peers who will in turn select the top Young EDGE Fund ideas who will benefit from mentoring and support through the Princes Trust Youth Business Scotland to turn their ideas into profitable businesses.
