Liam Craig launches new SPFL sticker album

Hibs' captain Liam Craig has helped to launch the first ever SPFL sticker collection at the club's training centre.

Craig also revealed that he has already been impressed by the three new loan deals, Danny Haynes whom he played with at Ipswich, Duncan Watmore and Daniel Boateng.

He said: "It's always good when new faces come in, it gives the place a lift with fresh competition for places. From what the guys are showing in training the fans should be excited. Even at the back with Daniel he tries to get forward and Duncan and Danny are really positive and creative in what they do.

"I think the break has helped us because we have players back from suspension and injury so it will be a much bigger squad for the manager to pick from."

"With Kevin (Moon) and Liam Fox in the middle of the park they have two very good football players there. Fraser Mullen's gone there and they have Joe Cardle on the wing so there are one or two players there that can cause us problems if we're not at it, but if we are professional and approach the game with the right mentality then we will go on and win the game."
