

Sky's the limit in Livingston



One of the biggest employers in Livingston, has announced plans for a new academy which will be used to educate school pupils from across Scotland in media skills. Sky has been granted planning permission for a brand new dedicated learning facility to be located at its existing Livingston site.

Sky Academy Skills Studios Livingston aims to provide 12,000 young people per year with a free learning experience that will link to the Scottish Curriculum for Excellence and help students build life skills. Students will be able to create their own TV report about a subject they are studying at school using Sky's state-of-the-art technology, including broadcast quality cameras, green screens and touch screen edit tables.



Work will begin on Sky Academy Skills Studios in Scotland this month, with an expected launch date in early 2015. The facility will build on the success of the first Sky Academy Skills Studios at Sky's headquarters in West London. Since its launch in September 2012, 18,000 students have taken part in the experience, which is proven to inspire students and help them build skills such as communication, creativity and team work.

The Skills Studios in Livingston are part of Sky Academy, a ground-breaking set of initiatives that aims to help one million young people build skills, confidence and self-belief by 2020.

Teachers will be able to sign their schools up for the experience from autumn 2014.”
