It appears that the Kylvie cow will be no more. When the council's [Development Management Sub-Committee](#) meets later this morning they are set to reject the retrospective planning application for the cow 'sculpture' which is suspended from the outer facade of the building, in spite of support for the cow to stay where it is.

A petition of almost 3000 signatures has done nothing to convince the planners that the cow is much loved and that people would like to see it remain in situ. The planners are upholding their view that the appearance of the category A listed building is being adversely affected and so the cow will have to be re-mooved. The structure is deemed as advertising and they also argue that the feature does not enhance the building. The community council thought it might be a good idea to have a temporary consent granted, but the council is not convinced.
