

Operation Wolf – Drugs seized in Gorgie



Following a two-day operation in the Gorgie Road area of Edinburgh, Police have seized cannabis worth £103,000 yesterday as Operation Wolf activities continued across the city.

After attending at the address, police discovered dried buds worth £83,320 and mature plants valued at £19,500.

Inquiries are ongoing to establish the person responsible.

Further days of action will take place across the Capital throughout May and police are keen to build on the early success of Operation Wolf.

Police Constable Kris Harvey said: “This is a fantastic result for Operation Wolf, and this sizeable find will have a knock-on effect on organised crime.

“Operation Wolf continues to address the issues that are of concern to our communities in Edinburgh and there will be continuing enforcement.”

Supt. Matt Richards, who is leading on Operation Wolf, added: “The work by PC Harvey and colleagues on the Operation Wolf initiative highlights the importance the public providing us with information, and the speed by which Operation Wolf allows us to react to their concerns.
