EDINBURGH SCHOOLS ARE TOP OF THE CLASS AS NATIONAL AWARD FINALISTS for Scottish Education Awards 2014

Two finalists from Edinburgh have beaten off stiff competition from across Scotland to be shortlisted at this year's Scottish Education Awards.

Tollcross Primary has been named as a finalist for the Creative Learning Award to recognise its Outdoor PE Project which involved creating an activity course consisting of eight stations along the Union Canal. Pupils used technology to create QR codes which give instructions for each activity, all of which develop a core PE skill. The project successfully linked the academic areas of health and wellbeing, PE and technologies.

Literacies for Employability East has also been named as a finalist in the Innovation in Literacy and Numeracy Teaching Practice Award category. The successful programme for young people aged 16-25 in the Craigmillar area has helped learners to achieve nationally recognised qualifications, improving their confidence and job prospects.
