## Film in the City in June

✓ June is officially movie month in Edinburgh, and it all begins this Sunday 8 June 2014.

In the build-up to the Edinburgh International Film Festival 2014 (18-29 June 2014), **This is Edinburgh**, in collaboration with the EIFF, is inviting locals of all ages to a number of free outdoor cinema screenings and movie related workshops across the city centre.

Kicking off **Film in the City** on 8 June, the Grassmarket will be transformed with family-friendly 'dance-along' screenings of musical favourites such as Grease and Top Hat. The following weekend will see outdoor screenings return to St Andrew Square (13-15 June) with a collection of cinematic gems. Film in the City will finish up with a packed weekend programme (20- 22 June) of movie inspired workshops, engaging Q&As and animation sessions at Festival Square. Highlights include special animation workshops celebrating the pioneering filmmaker Norman McLaren.

Film in the City aims to build on that buzz and create some new exciting, free events that everyone can come along and enjoy.
