Only a top class performance from Dunfermline's on-loan goalkeeper Ryan Scully denied Hibs a comfortable win at East End Park last night.

Alan Stubbs' men created several good chances in front of a large travelling support but were unable grab the third victory of the pre-season build up.

Trialist Luke Coulson started the game as Stubbs tried a 5-3-2 formation with Michael Nelson, Jordon Forster and Callum Booth in the centre of the defence.

Injuries to Jason Cummings and Paul Heffernan meant that Danny Handling started up front with Melrose youngster Lewis Allan.

New signing Farad El Alagui did not make the squad.

Hibs started brightly and in the ninth minute Scott Robertson was brought down inside the box and referee Stephen Finnie awarded the penalty, but Liam Craig's (Pictured) well struck effort was saved by Scully.

Craig then struck the bar with a header before Stevenson had the ball in the net but this was rightly disallowed for an infringement.

The biggest talking points of the first half came when Booth's volleyed clearance struck a passing seagull then Coulson almost grabbed the lead with a cross just before the break.

In the second half Craig's powerful left-footed shot was deflected for a corner then Stevenson's close range header was well saved.

Allan had a great chance to score his second goal for the club after a defensive error but after finding himself one on one with Scully, his shot rolled inches wide of the far post.

Craig once again went close then Hibs had a penalty claim turned down as they completely dominated possession.

The Pars thought they had won the game in the closing minutes when Byrne had the ball in the net but his effort was disallowed for offside.

Overall Hibernian will be satisfied with the performance — another 90 minutes of fitness in the bank heading into the start of the new season.

Hibs' next game is against Stirling Albion at Forthbank on Sunday (20 July, kick off 2pm).
