Inspired by artist Paul Cummins' poppies at the Tower of London, Boroughmuir High School pupils in Mr Thomson's Art & Design classes have created a 'poppy field' to commemorate the First World War Fallen from Boroughmuir High School.

This collective group art project involved 60 pupils handmaking, painting and naming a clay poppy for each of the 166 former pupils and staff who died in the Great War.

The poppies will be held by each senior pupil during the School's annual Remembrance Service today before being 'planted' in the field inside the school building, facing the school War Memorial, as a reminder to all staff and visitors of the sacrifice Boroughmuir staff and pupils made a century ago.

The Scottish Parliament has launched its Apprenticeship Programme which will bring in 20 apprentices over the next four years with 11 apprentices in 2015 and the remaining 9 in 2016. The programme is a Scotland-wide initiative and is open to anyone aged between 16-24 years old.

Apprenticeships are being offered across a variety of roles in the Parliament including Business Admin, Customer Services, Human Resources, Facilities Management and IT.

Applications open on Friday 21 November and close at midnight on Sunday 7 December.

The Parliament is keen to target as wide an audience as possible, and are holding an Open Day at the Scottish Parliament building on Friday 21 November 2014 where young people will have the opportunity to meet with the staff, find out more about the apprenticeships and ask any questions about the recruitment process. This is a unique opportunity and we want to ensure that every young person in Scotland has the chance to apply and build a career in the Parliament.
