In Autumn 2014 the school merged its two campuses, moving pupils from the 179-year-old Craigmillar Park campus to the buildings in Morningside which feature wide corridors with contrasting colours to enable independent navigation for pupils with low vision, specialist classrooms, a multi-use games area and a flat for visiting parents and carers.
