In total 146 social enterprises from across the UK, including 30 from Scotland, were given SEDA awards this year amounting to £1.2million in prize money. Winners receive awards of between £5,000 and £20,000 to fund a specific growth project that will help to increase their social impact.

Alongside the prize money, the winning social enterprises receive a business support package from Santander which includes business webinars, full funded internships, consultancy days and the opportunity to network with other social entrepreneurs and small business owners.

Graham Silcock, Santander Regional Director, Scotland, said: "This year's SEDA winners have demonstrated great potential to grow their business. We hope that the financial assistance and the support programme will help them reach their potential and increase their social impact."
