Detailed <u>proposals</u> were yesterday unveiled by the City of Edinburgh Council designed to make its services more efficient and customer focused, while addressing a budget gap of £67 million over the next three years.

As one of fastest growing local authority areas in Scotland, Edinburgh is facing an ever increasing demand for Council services, while the funds available to meet this demand are set to stay the same over the next few years.

A <u>blueprint</u> for the future organisation of the Council and was agreed in December 2014, subject to consultation. This report highlighted key areas where future cost savings and service improvements could be achieved.
