It doesn't matter that we're not all virtuosos at our chosen instrument, we're having fun and making music.

"We're really looking forward to celebrating our 20th birthday and hope as many people as possible will come along to make it a very special occasion."

Founder member Catriona Crosby said:

"When a small group of musicians got together in 1995 and decided to form an orchestra, I don't think any of us believed it would still be going in 20 years' time.

"But not only is it still going, it's going from strength to strength and our numbers are continuing to grow. It's a fun way to make music in a relaxed environment and I'm sure the orchestra will go on for many years to come, giving pleasure to players and, hopefully, our audiences."

The concert takes place on 28 May at 7.30pm in Stockbridge Parish Church and tickets are available on the door.
