The Scottish-American War Memorial, known as 'The Call', is located in West Princes Street Gardens, Edinburgh and each year on American Memorial Day, which is a national holiday in the US, the English-Speaking Union Scotland hosts this event at which representatives from Governments, Parliament and Armed Forces gather to remember those who lost their lives in 'The Great War' and to recognise the enduring family ties and friendships that exist between the US and Scotland.
