Although most of the reports produced for today's meeting bear the name of Director Health and Social Care, Peter Gabbitas, there is some doubt over his future.

The Edinburgh Evening News reported last week that he had taken leave and may not be returning to his position in light of the overspend in this area of council finances.

The council's spending in this area was about £9million more than budgeted for last year, but the effect over the full year was more than that at £16.5million. An action plan has been drawn up to reduce the pressure on council finances which will reduce the Health and Social care budget by £11.6million. This is one of the areas of council spending that is difficult to cut except by efficiencies, and of course the amalgamation of council and NHS which Mr Gabbitas was overseeing was one way intended to make major savings.

This matter has involved the Chief Executive, Sue Bruce, the Director of Corporate Governance and the Convener of Finance along with KPMG to try and unravel the budgetary problems. One

of the recommendations is to extend the contract with KPMG by three months at a cost of £166,000.
