

Rob Jones appointed temporary manager of Doncaster Rovers



Former Hibs' captain Rob Jones has been appointed temporary manager of Doncaster Rovers following the dismissal of Paul Dickov.

Jones had a successful spell at Easter Road under Tony Mowbray and John Collins. He captained the team that won the CIS League Cup in 2007 and was a popular player with the supporters.

The club broke the news with a statement on their website which reads: "David Blunt, Chairman of Doncaster Rovers Football Club has today confirmed that Paul Dickov has left his position as first team manager based on performance to date.

"The Board are ambitious for a top six finish and that is, and will remain our aim.

"The club will now seek applications for the post on a permanent basis. The club will not rush into making any decision, the recruitment process will be thorough and we will ensure that we appoint the strongest candidate for the position.
