

John McGinn credits his goal to 'Taff' Holden



Hibs' midfielder John McGinn scored a contender for 'Goal of the Season' with a sensational 25 yard strike which flew into the top corner of the net with Raith Rovers' keeper Kevin Cuthbert rooted to the spot, but the summer signing refuses to take all the credit.

Speaking to Cliff pike from Hibs' TV immediately after the game, McGinn joked: "It was a fluke. No, I've been working with Taff (Andy Holden) at training and he has been telling me that I have that in my locker so the credit for the goal goes to him.
