

# What's On In Edinburgh – Grassmarket free Cinema



The excellent **Grassmarket Community Project** screens a film almost every week – and admission is totally *free*, although they would of course appreciate any donations towards their work with some of Edinburgh's most vulnerable citizens. On Monday 16th November you can see ***Amélie* (15)**, (in French with English subtitles) which is shown as part of the **British Film Institute's Love season** ('Films to fall in love with. Films to break your heart').

***Amélie***, starring **Audrey Tautou**, is a fanciful comedy about a young woman who discreetly orchestrates the lives of the people around her, creating a world exclusively of her own making – but when Amélie falls in love herself, she realises that making neat solutions is not as easy as it seems.
