outdoor LED screen, measuring 100 square metres. All visitors have to do to enjoy the showing is tune in to the movie through the car radio.

On average, British movie-goers now pay £6.53 to see a film at the cinema, whereas tickets to the Edinburgh Christmas Spectacular are just £26 per car. A standard car of five people will pay only £5.20 per person. Visitors can bring their own food and drink or buy the handmade street food from the nearby stalls. The Lapland market has free parking and is open from 10.30am until 9pm between the 19th and 23rd December.
