Edinburgh residents looking to make space for visiting family members over the festive period can have bulky furniture items collected for free through the National Re-use Phone Line. The free service, managed by Zero Waste Scotland, collects unwanted items such as wardrobes, chests of drawers, sideboards, tables, sofas and beds that are in re-usable condition and takes them away to be used again.

The service is a hassle-free way to move items on that you no longer want in a way that's good for both planet and pocket. The free service also ensures items in good condition go on to have a longer life, which reduces their impact on the environment.

Local residents can simply call **0800 0665 820** to pass their items on. Items are collected by local re-use organisations which sell the furniture to support good causes. The phone line is open from 9am to 5pm and you can donate online at any time at [www.reusephonenumber.com](http://www.reusephonenumber.com).
