There are 18 streets in Portobello/Craigmillar Ward due to get more bins for recycling as more and more people are taking part since the new system was introduced and collection capacity has to be increased.

The Thistle charity in Craigmillar subsidise their gym memberships so we can keep the price as low as possible. Annual membership to their gym in Craigmillar is only £25. I join! The Thistle's new Tudsbery meaning to Centre building was given an construction trade award recently for Practical Completion. It was absolutely pelting down rain. I am a huge fan of community gardening and all the benefits it can bring for individuals involved but also its capacity to create and sustain neighbourhoods and communities; bringing individuals and families together. We have at least ten such spaces in Greater Craigmillar with the prospect of more. And there are at least that number in and around Portobello and Brunstane. There's huge potential there for working together!

It was a real pleasure to be at the second **Cyrenians Breakfast** on Thursday morning, hearing more first-hand stories about the work they do and discussing what we need all need to do together to tackle food poverty. Conclusion — Everybody needs something to eat <u>and</u> someone to eat with. So how do we help make it happen?

As I said last week, I wanted confirmation of the Committee decision about **Brighton Place** — which option and the cost was decided upon at Transport and Environment Committee — carriageway reconstruction or covering in asphalt leaving the setts in place? I also asked what process would be used to

decide what projects will come forward within the budget saved. Will the setts at the junctions of the side streets like East and West Brighton Place and Lee Crescent be retained and might they be re-laid as part of the project to retain at least *some* of the historic fabric in Portobello Conservation Area? I got the attached reply on this and a couple of other related issues constituents have raised with me about Brighton Place.

The Council's East Neighbourhood roads team have given us Councillors advance notice that Newcraighall Road will be closed for nearly a month, from Monday 8 February to Sunday 6 March for carriageway resurfacing and reconstructing the footway on Newcraighall Road between Newcraighall Primary School and the City boundary. During this time local access will be maintained to a limited extent. Pedestrian access will be maintained for the duration of the works. I have map and more details if you want it.
