Edinburgh's Lord Provost Donald Wilson finished the Virgin Money London Marathon to raise £4,073.75 and counting for his One City Trust Rapid Action Fund.

Running in his trademark 'chain' of office running gear, he completed the 26.2 miles in four hours and 56 minutes, beating his previous 2015 record of five hours two minutes and 50 seconds.
