

Concern about speeding drivers in East Lothian



Police in East Lothian will continue to conduct proactive patrols in the Dunbar and Tynninghame areas following complaints about speeding.

On Wednesday officers attended a public meeting at Tynninghame Village Hall to discuss community concerns.

These included speeding vehicles, specifically motorbikes, on the A198 and A199.

Later that evening, a 65-year-old male driver was issued with a fixed penalty ticket for speeding in Dunbar.

A 20-year-old male driver was issued with a fixed penalty ticket and an anti-social behaviour warning in Whitekirk.

Community Sergeant Scott Nicolson said: "Following the public meeting, we've been able to focus our efforts on deterring and detecting dangerous driver behaviour in the areas highlighted to us.

"We also received a number of calls from concerned residents as a result, and I want to reassure the community that we'll act on all the information we receive."
