At the City Art Centre this summer there is a major new exhibition of two Scottish artists.

William Gillies and John Maxwell were among the most important Scottish artists of the 20th century. Gillies painted Borders landscapes and Highland watercolours, while Maxwell depicted flowers and timeless nudes. They were lifelong friends who met at Edinburgh College of Art in the early 1920s.

Forming the bulk of the exhibition is a group of 43 artworks making up the Fletcher Collection which are on long term loan to the gallery. This will be the first time that the whole collection has been displayed at one time.

Councillor Richard Lewis, Edinburgh's Convener of Culture and Sport, said: "This is a rare opportunity to see some of the finest artworks by William Gillies and John Maxwell — two very distinctive Scottish artists. This exhibition is particularly exciting considering the Fletcher Collection is being shown together for the first time in 20 years."
