Harry Benson returns home to Scotland with a retrospective exhibition

The latest free exhibition at the Scottish Parliament is a collection of Harry Benson's photographs taken in America over the last 50 years.

Benson was a press photographer in Glasgow and was asked to go to the US with The Beatles. He was about to set off on a trip to Africa and was not enthusiastic, but he never came home, and in 1998 gained US citizenship.



Harry Benson's retrospective exhibition opens at Holyrood on 12 August.

His work includes photos of all recent American presidents as well as photos documenting racial issues in America in the 1960s.

The photos tell the story of his life and work, but they are also a documentary of recent history in the States.



Now in his eighties it appears that he has not yet retired. He said proudly that he had recently photographed Donald Trump, the Republican presidential nominee, for Time magazine.

To a hushed gathering of photographers this morning at Holyrood he explained that he very much hopes that it will be Hillary Clinton who becomes the next President.
