The duo will be appearing in Craiglockhart Parish Church on Saturday, 17 September the evening after their gig at Cupar Blues & Beyond Club in Fife.

"Blues and church music are two of the main ingredients in jazz," says Wiszniewski, who is also one of the stars of the Scottish National Jazz Orchestra's saxophone section. "Jazz musicians improvise on blues scales and a lot of jazz, especially the soul-jazz style that came out of the 1950s and 1960s, draws on gospel music, so we should be at home in both venues."
